Moving Checklist

Moving to a new home is exciting—but it can also be overwhelming. With the right movers and a flexible plan, you can avoid most of the stress.

Start Planning

- Decide what moving services you need: packing, storage, unpacking, or setup.
- Tailor services to fit your budget.
- Research movers early to avoid last-minute stress.

Compare Movers

- Get **in-person estimates** from multiple companies. Prices are based on the weight of your items, moving distance, and extra services.
- Show the estimator **everything** you plan to move.
- Ask for a written explanation of rates, liability, pickup/delivery schedules, and claims protection.
- Interstate moves: movers must provide *Your Rights and Responsibilities When You Move* and information on neutral dispute resolution, per FHWA requirements.

Be Prepared

- Review your homeowner's insurance for moving coverage.
- Movers typically offer:
 - Released value insurance (~\$0.60 per lb. per item).
 - Full replacement value insurance (must be signed for).

- Consider riders for special valuables (art, heirlooms, collectibles).
- File claims immediately if damage occurs—keep all packing materials for inspection.

Packing & Organizing Tips

- Pack infrequently used items first.
- Sort belongings into Keep, Donate, or Throw Away.
- Create an inventory sheet for valuables and track which boxes they're in.
- Label boxes clearly by room; use colored stickers or tape for easy sorting.
- Give movers a floorplan of your new home for efficient unloading.
- Keep boxes under **50 lbs.**; put heavy items in small boxes, lighter items in larger ones.
- Dispose of non-movable items (flammables, propane, fuel).
- Empty gas-powered equipment before transport.
- Take photos of electronics before disconnecting wires.
- Pack a personal overnight bag with essentials: toiletries, clothes, meds, chargers, and snacks.

A smooth move comes down to preparation, the right mover, and smart packing. Plan ahead, stay organized, and you'll be settling into your new home with less stress and more excitement.
